Crabapple Academy offers a caring and consistent atmosphere for school children after a long day at school. When the “schoolers,” as we call them, enter the doors of Crabapple Academy in the afternoon, they are greeted with kind smiles and a nutritious snack. The children have an opportunity to talk about their day and to socialize with their friends while they snack. Children with homework are given plenty of time and ample opportunity for one-on-one help each day. Once homework is completed, the schoolers will play outdoors in their own play area (equipped with a basketball court, “big kid” sized playground and swings, and a large open area for ball play), and later will return inside for creating art, playing board or organized games, or participating in another activity of their choosing. Movies are sometimes an option on Fridays but we try to avoid “screen time” while the kids are in our care. For that reason, we ask that electronic devices be kept at home or confined to their backpacks once the kids arrive at our center.

Our familiar and cozy environment allows the school-aged children the feeling of coming “home,” while still providing academic support and encouragement as well as a chance to unwind from a rigorous school day. It is our philosophy that after a highly structured school day, kids should have some control over their afternoons and that a loosely structured environment is best.

We welcome students to participate in the extra activities we plan on Teacher Work Days, school holidays, and during Summer Break. Our teachers look forward to the privilege of helping your school-aged child enjoy the transitional hours between school and home.
